72 – FYI – CABIN CURTAINS Last winter during our travels Cathey had an idea on how to separate the front cabin area from the rest of the coach while on the road, making a smaller front cabin space to be heated. Nothing exotic but highly effective, her plan was to install a shower tension rod between the two overhead cabinets then hang a pair of ceiling length curtains to block air movement in or out of the front of the coach. The tension rod was purchased from Walmart in a pleasing bronze/brown color. The two curtains are a medium density brown fabric.



Above are the curtains with the front slides open showing how the tension rod is positioned between the overhead cabinets. Both rod ends are carefully positioned to allow the cabinet doors to be opened and closed with the rod and curtains left in place. We leave rod and curtains in place at all times. The next two photos show how the curtains can be tucked over the corner of the two cornices then down the opening beside the corbels.
